WHAT IS REDSIEGA?

REDSIEGA is a research network funded by the Ministry of Science and Innovation and the State Research Agency, established in 2023. It comprises 21 researchers from the PAYTEMAL group (UAM), ARPE-Territorial Observatory (UNIOVI), Water and Global Change (CREAF), INVESTER (ULE), Gizapre-GPAC (UPV/EHU), and the Climatology Laboratory (UA).

WHO WE ARE

The network is composed of six research groups that provide diverse perspectives on this agro-landscape. We are interested in understanding and comparing its environmental, landscape, and heritage values across different domains, as well as its dynamics and management practices. We also examine the influence of climate change and potential adaptations, alongside policies and governance, the latter being seen as a crucial factor in developing effective and participatory strategies for sustainable and inclusive land management. This involves engaging all social stakeholders and promoting resilience and sustainable development in these areas.



OUR OBJECTIVES

- ✓ To create an alliance of institutions and research groups that provide an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary perspective on the meadow agro-system of the Iberian mountains and its future in the face of climate change.
- ✓ To carry out a diagnosis of the meadow agro-system in various case studies.
- ✓ To consolidate REDSIEGA for future joint research and projects.
- ✓ To transfer knowledge and diagnostics to other geographical contexts and share the results with society.
- ✓ To promote the internationalisation of REDSIEGA.

SEMINARS



One of the main activities of REDSIEGA is the organisation of two collective seminars, where various researchers share their experiences and knowledge regarding grazing, its communities, and the pastures.

The first seminar took place on 17 May 2024 in Alameda del Lozoya, Madrid, where participants visited the fenced fields of Alameda del Valle.

The next seminar is scheduled to be held in Asturias and León in June 2025.
